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Dr. Atkins is the Chief Medical Officer in the Center for Outcomes and Evidence at the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ). In that role, he is responsible for coordinating the Agency's research portfolio on care management and providing scientific oversight of the work of 13 AHRQ-funded Evidence-based Practice Centers. Dr. Atkins received his M.D. degree from Yale University and completed his internal medicine residency at the University of Pittsburgh. He completed a fellowship in primary care medicine at the University of Washington, where he received an M.P.H. degree in epidemiology and served on the faculty at Harborview Medical Center. From 1993 through 2002 Dr. Atkins served as Science Adviser and Project Director for the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF). He was a primary author and editor of the *Guide to Clinical Preventive Services, 2nd edition*, the report detailing the USPSTF's evidence-based guidelines for preventive care, and directed the ongoing work of the current USPSTF to update those recommendations. Dr. Atkins has written and lectured widely on disease prevention and health promotion, medical screening, medical guidelines and evidence-based medicine, and the work of the Task Force.
