

Dennis O. Dixon, Ph.D.

Dr. Dixon earned his doctorate in mathematical statistics from Johns Hopkins University. He is a mathematical statistician in the Biostatistics Research Branch of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), National Institutes of Health, and has written 100 research articles for statistical and medical research journals and books. Dr. Dixon serves as a senior adviser for the design and analysis of federally sponsored research on interventions to prevent or treat human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS).

He is Vice Chair of the NIAID Institutional Review Board for intramural clinical research and is chair or member of five data and safety monitoring boards. Dr. Dixon is President of the Society for Clinical Trials and a member of the International Biometric Society, American Statistical Association, International Society for Clinical Biostatistics, and Kennedy Institute of Ethics.
