

Constantine Frangakis, Ph.D.

Dr. Frangakis is Associate Professor in the Department of Biostatistics, Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, Baltimore, Maryland. His research has included work on statistical methods for partially controlled studies, the HIV/STD Network Prevention Intervention Trial in Northern Vietnam, depression in Alzheimer's disease, analytical methods for observational drug user cohorts, transportation safety data, fatigue in cancer patients, and studies of social factors influencing the risk of preterm delivery. Dr. Frangakis also has served as a consultant to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention on an anthrax project. He is a member of the American Statistical Association, Institute of Mathematical Statistics, and International Biometric Society. In 2002 Dr. Frangakis received the H.C. Yang Memorial Faculty Award in Cancer Prevention for innovation in cancer prevention research from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, and in 2003 he was elected Fellow of the Center for Advanced Studies in the Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University in California.
