

R. Brian Haynes, M.D., Ph.D.

Dr. Haynes received his M.D. degree in 1971 from the University of Alberta in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, and his Ph.D. degree in clinical epidemiology in 1975 from McMaster University in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. He completed residency training in internal medicine at the Toronto Hospital in Toronto, Ontario, and St Thomas Hospital in London, United Kingdom, and joined the Faculty of Health Sciences at McMaster University in 1977, where he is Professor of Clinical Epidemiology and Medicine, Chair of the Department of Clinical Epidemiology and Biostatistics, Chief of the Health Information Research Unit, and a member of the active medical staff of the Hamilton Health Sciences Foundation.

Dr. Haynes' main research interests are methodologies for evaluating health care interventions and improving health care through enhancing the validation, distillation, dissemination, and application of health care knowledge. He also has a longstanding interest in interventions to help patients follow their prescribed medication regimens. Dr. Haynes is a member of the Working Group on Evidence-Based Medicine, which pioneered the concepts of evidence-based health care, and Founding Editor of several "evidence-based" journals, including *ACP Journal Club*, *Evidence-Based Medicine*, *Evidence-Based Mental Health*, and *Evidence-Based Nursing*, and several electronic alerting services, including, BMJUpdates⁺ and Medscape Best Evidence.
