

**Chad M. Heilig, Ph.D.**

Dr. Heilig manages the Human Research Protection Office (HRPO) at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The HRPO is located within the Office of Scientific Regulatory Services, Office of the Chief Science Officer. After receiving his Ph.D. degree in statistics from the University of California, Berkeley, he joined the CDC as a contractor in 1997 and as an employee in 2000. Until late 2004 Dr. Heilig collaborated with investigators in CDC's Division of Reproductive Health on longitudinal studies in U.S. women, a retrospective cohort study to estimate HIV infectivity among monogamous women, and clinical trials aimed at preventing HIV or sexually transmitted infections in developing countries. During his 4 years as a member of a CDC institutional review board, he developed his interest in the interplay between methodological and ethical issues in research activities involving human subjects. Dr. Heilig represents the CDC on the Federal Adverse Event Task Force and as an *ex officio* member of the Secretary's Advisory Committee on Human Research Protections.
