

**Marcel E. Salive, M.D., M.P.H.**

Dr. Salive is Director of the Division of Medical and Surgical Services within the Coverage and Analysis Group of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The Division is responsible for developing and maintaining coverage decisions for all Medicare beneficiaries using a rigorous and open evidence-based process. The specific clinical areas under the purview of this Division include surgery, anesthesia, diagnostics, medicine (including preventive and alternative), therapy (physical, occupational, speech-language pathology services), implantable medical devices, solid-organ transplants, and radiology.

Prior to joining the CMS, Dr. Salive held leadership positions with the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and U.S. the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). He previously served as Acting Deputy Leader of the Prevention Scientific Research Group at the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI), NIH. Dr. Salive led and served on the research teams for multicenter clinical trials of cardiovascular disease prevention strategies, including the treatment of diabetes, hypertension, and dyslipidemia in primary care. He was NHLBI leader of the clinical trial demonstrating lives saved by public access defibrillation in community settings. Dr. Salive has developed and led research initiatives in several areas, including outcomes research, Alzheimer's disease etiology, vaccine safety, and translation of clinical research into primary care practice. From 1996-1999 Dr. Salive was Chief of the FDA's Epidemiology Branch, where he had overall responsibility for vaccine safety surveillance through the national Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System and monitored the safety of biotechnology therapeutics. He has contributed to more than 70 peer-reviewed articles, book chapters, and other publications. Dr. Salive is a Fellow of the American College of Preventive Medicine (ACPM) and the American Heart Association. He was selected as a 2003 DHHS Primary Health Care Policy Fellow. Dr. Salive's awards include the Surgeon General's Exemplary Service Medal and an ACPM Distinguished Service Award. He is a Captain in the Commissioned Corps of the U.S. Public Health Service.
