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Dr. Zarin is Director of ClinicalTrials.gov and Assistant Director for Clinical Research Projects at the Lister Hill National Center for Biomedical Communications in the National Library of Medicine, National Institutes of Health. In this capacity, Dr. Zarin oversees the development and operation of an international registry of clinical trials.

Previously, she served as Director of the Technology Assessment Program (TAP) at the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Dr. Zarin was responsible for a national program that performs assessments of diagnostic and therapeutic interventions to guide clinical and policy decisionmakers. The AHRQ TAP provides scientific support for the national Medicare coverage process.

Dr. Zarin graduated from Stanford University and received her M.D. degree from Harvard Medical School. She completed a clinical decisionmaking fellowship and is board certified in general psychiatry and child and adolescent psychiatry. Her academic interests are in the area of evidence-based clinical and policy decisionmaking.
