

Julie Magno Zito, Ph.D.

Dr. Zito is Associate Professor of Pharmacy and Psychiatry at the University of Maryland, Baltimore. Her education includes a pharmacy degree, a master's degree in pharmaceutical sciences, and a Ph.D. degree in social pharmacy, with a minor in epidemiology. Dr. Zito is trained in pharmacoepidemiology and has written more than 75 papers dealing with the use of psychotropic medications in community treated populations. Her most recent research focusing on children and adolescents has received widespread media attention. Dr. Zito has received more than \$3 million in foundation and Federal funding (e.g., from the National Institute of Mental Health and National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, both at the National Institutes of Health). Prior to coming to the University of Maryland, Baltimore, she was employed by the New York State Office of Mental Health at the Nathan Kline Institute where she authored the 1994 textbook *Psychotherapeutic Drug Monitoring*. The text provided criteria to New York State prescribing psychiatrists for the use and monitoring of psychotropics in individuals with severe mental disorders. Dr. Zito has been active in the leadership of the Medical Care Section of the American Public Health Association.
